Key Learning

- Some animals live on farms such as cows, pigs, sheep, goats, ducks and chickens. We can get food from most farmyard animals.
- Cows produce milk. Milk can be used to make cheese, butter and yoghurt.
- Chickens lay eggs, which can be collected and eaten.
- Sheep can be shorn to give us wool.
- Food can also be grown on farms. These are called crops.
- Farmers work on farms to look after animals and tend to crops.
- Farmers used equipment such as ploughs and tractors to help them with their work.

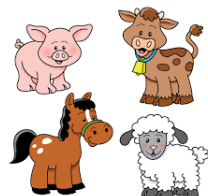

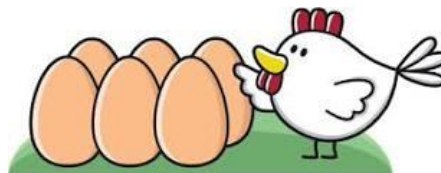
